**FROM THE WEBMINISTER**



All,

First of all, a huge thanks to Captain Dyderich Wolfhart for his service to our fair Barony of Sternfeld. His time as the Web Minister is greatly appreciated!

I am humbled by the group's decision to allow me to serve as your webminister. Also thanks to Lord Eadric of Grenfeld for his willingness to be my deputy and work with me on the visual aspects of the site. As of this writing, I'm still in the process of getting access to the Sternfeld site and trying to find my bearings, so please bear with me!

Where do we go from here? That's a question I'm asking myself, certainly. Initially, I see a few immediate things that need to be done - I'm hard at work on pulling together the site for Crown Tourney, and attempting to get that online by mid-month. Lady Odile, the Chronicler, has been working

diligently on obtaining web site publication rights for all articles published in the Sternfeld Star, with the intention of putting them on the web site. Once she has those rights, I plan to get the Star published online as soon as I can, including back issues to the beginning of Odile's term in office. I am also looking into ways to enable Odile to submit the Star to the website and have it post automatically, going forward.

I'm also working on developing a template for event websites that can be reused each time we have an event. This will enable us to "fill in the blanks" and have a good looking, functional site that has all the information needed with less effort. Included in that is some automation to collect information like class submissions, etc. I'm in touch with a Barony that has done this before to see if we can use/adapt their solution rather than starting entirely from scratch.


Regarding the core website itself, I don't plan on doing a major redesign, at least not yet. We have a workable framework out there that looks good and has the required pieces. The main changes I'm planning on making are updating the links and refreshing the information posted to be current.

Regarding the Simple Day website, I'm planning on leaving it hosted where it currently is (on my personal/business webspace) - it's far too close to the event date to move it to our web host, what with links already being posted in several places online. Future event websites will likely be hosted on the Sternfeld site.

The Chivalry is unique in that it comprises two equal parts: the Knights, and the Masters at Arms. The choice of which responsibility to choose is left to the prospective candidate. While many of the duties of the two are the same, the chief distinction is that, while Knights must swear an oath of fealty to the Crown, Masters at Arms do so at their own discretion, much the same as Masters of the other peerage orders. Knights are addressed as Sir – some female Knights may choose to use the title Dame, but many take the title Sir as well. Masters of Arms are addressed as Master or Mistress. Masters of Arms are entitled to wear a white baldric (much like a white sash worn across the body), while Knights are entitled to wear a white belt, as well as a gold chain about the neck and gold spurs. Knights and Masters often take students into a formal relationship, and most often these Squires are gifted with a red belt and a silver chain and spurs.

In July, we will discuss those awards that are given for excellence in archery: the Dragon's Barb and the Greenwood Company.



Additionally, it should be mentioned that at one time there was an award given for combat called the Order of the Gaping Wound. It was given in recognition to those who had been injured in armored combat to a degree requiring severe medical attention, such as surgery or hospitalization. While this Order has been closed since October, 1975, with no new members being admitted, there are still those who bear this award, and a few for whom this is the highest award received, thus determining their position in precedence. The Order of the Gaping Wound was considered immediately below the Dragon's Tooth (and equivalent awards), but above a simple Award of Arms.



As mentioned earlier, the Order of the Gold Mace is the Grant-of-Arms-level armored combat award. Considered a more prestigious rank of the Red Company, its recipients are generally called 'Captain,' though they may use the title The Honorable Lord or Lady, as well. This award is given "to individuals who, in the sight of the Crown, have shown both excellence and leadership in melee and/or tournament combat, and who have trained others in these skills (*MK Law XVII-2602*)." Like the Red Company, the focus on melee and/or tournament combat is evident, but this award emphasizes both the need to be a skilled teacher as well as fighter, as well as demanding a higher level of skill than a Red Company award would require. Those who receive this award are equal in precedence with those who have received the Evergreen, Greenwood Company, Bronze Ring, and White Lance. They are higher in precedence than those who have a simple Grant of Arms only, but lower than those who have received the Dragon's Heart. You will notice the badge of the award is very similar to the badge for the Red Company: the major differences are that the maces of this badge are gold instead of silver, and a gold border edges the otherwise-identical red field.

The culmination of an Armored Combat career is the Order of the Chivalry – a peerage, equivalent to the Laurel, which we discussed last month, and to the Pelican, which will be discussed in future months. Like other peerages, it carries with it a solemn duty and responsibility both to the Crown, to aid them in upholding the Kingdom, and to the populace, to defend and honor them, particularly those too weak to defend themselves. "The candidate must be considered the equal of his or her prospective peers with the basic weapons of tournament combat. (*SCA Corpora VIII-A4-a*).” The Oath of the Chivalry pledges:

*"[...]To ever be a good knight and true,  
Reverent and generous,*

## MIDDLE KINGDOM AWARDS - ARMORED COMBAT

Armored combat has a long and fabled history within the Middle Kingdom, and so unsurprisingly, there are several awards given for excellence in this domain.



The first of these is the Order of the Red Company. This award is given to “individuals who, in the sight of the Crown, have shown proficiency and leadership in melee and/or tournament combat (*MK Law XVII-1302*).”

Receiving this award conveys an Award of Arms if the recipient does not already possess one, much like the other arms-level awards. As the description suggests, to be considered worthy of this award, one must have developed a good deal of skill in armored combat, as well as showing leadership qualities. It is considered equal in precedence to several of the other arms-level awards, including the Dragon's Tooth, Dragon's Barb, Cavendish Knot, and White Chamfron, but is lower in precedence than a Purple Fret, or equivalent awards. Recipients of this award are often styled “Sergeant”, or they may choose to use the title Lord or Lady, as well. It is traditional for Sergeants of the Red Company to wear a red cloak or cape to distinguish their rank; some choose to do this on the field, others in Court, while some others seldom exercise this privilege. They may also bear the badge above, with silver maces on a red field. It is quite similar to the badge for the Award of the Gold Mace (discussed below), except in color and details of decoration.

Equal in precedence to the Red Company (and the other awards which are equal to it) is the combat award of the Dragon's Tooth. It is given to “individuals who, in the sight of the Crown, have performed dramatic deeds in the Arts Martial on behalf of the Middle Kingdom, above and beyond service normally expected of subjects of the Crown (*MK Law XVII-202*).” It is up to the Crown what kind of martial deeds they consider sufficiently dramatic, of course! The Dragon's Tooth can be received several times in one's lifetime, for different acts of dramatic skill, and is shown by wearing a dragon's tooth, if desired, or by displaying the badge of the award.
