



I await the reports from our other interest groups in preparation for my quarterly report...



From the Minister of Youth



May Business Meeting Minutes

Baronial Reports - The Baron reports that there have been several new people at events and practices recently. Additionally, in his words "everything's cool". Notably absent from everything: the health of the Baron and Baroness who were attending the meeting by phone so as not to infect their populace.

Great Offices:

Seneschal - Second pollings on several initiatives originally discussed at the Allthing were completed, as follows: A polling was made for \$300 for a new archery net. The polling passed. A polling was made to roll over the unused \$150 budget for the Coronet from 2011 into 2012's budget to help cover upcoming expenses such as the Baronial Coins. The polling passed. A polling was made to update the bylaws to cut the Chronicler budget for from \$300 to \$150 due to reduced printing of the Sternfeld Star (as it is available online).

The polling passed. A polling was made to add the Property Master to the bylaws and grant the position a \$250 annual budget. The polling passed.

Herald - Not present but will start to be present more often as he has graduated. Congratulations to our Herald on finishing his degree!

Chronicler - The May Star was published. Brigide plans to be at fighter practice next week with physical copies for those who want them. It is available online at http://www.midrealm.org/sternfeld/star_holding.php as well. Brigide is looking for new ideas for the Star - expect an article about this in the June edition. Brigide also wanted to remind officers that reports are due to her on the last day of each month for inclusion in the next month's Star. This means officer reports are due May 31st, people!

Exchequer - We have money in the bank. Ersebet is considering taking on Elisabetta as a deputy in the office with the eventual intention of stepping down.

Marshals:

Heavy - We have practice, it goes well.

Fence - Two youth swords have come in. They don't have buzzers, but that's ok as they are not required by Society Regulations. Lots of new people have come recently, including new fencers!

Archery - Archery is still going strong. The Marshall is happy, so the Barony is happy.

Youth - Youth fighting will meet early this month - this weekend (the 20th) instead of next weekend. There will be no pages' school or youth rapier fighting this time. Details are available on the web at <http://www.midrealm.org/sternfeld/youth.php>

Chirurgeon - No report.

Minister of Arts and Sciences - There are 3 or 4 items from our Barony going to the Kingdom A&S Faire at Crown Tourney. Our artisans are awesome!

Costumers - Didn't meet this month. Unclear if they will meet in June - stay posted for announcements.

Brewers - No comment.

Cooking - The Cook's group is planning their annual pilgrimage to Jungle Jim's Grocery Store. The Property Master reports he has purchased slightly more than \$700 of supplies - and got about \$850 worth (saving some money) of awesome cooking gear, including things to cook in and store food in, etc. He also purchased a dozen totes and is looking to purchase more cutting boards and sheet pans. He still has about \$500 left of the money that was polled on previously for these purposes. He welcomes your suggestions for what else is needed in the Baronial Feast equipment.

Ars Rustica - In late June there will be a slaughtering class. Details to be shared later.

Performing Arts - The group is looking for regular bardic site for monthly meetings.

Largesse League - There may be possible project time at Baronial Birthday. The A&S competition at Baronial Birthday is also Largesse related.

Lesser Offices:

Chatelaine - No silent auction happened at Coronation due to lack of space and time. She reports her quarterly report was submitted.

Minister of Youth - Activities happened at Grand Coronation and were well attended.

Property Master - Again mentioned he is taking suggestions for things that the Barony might need. The question of more gravel for the storage site has been delayed until next month. He will be purchasing a dolly/rolling cart using some of his annual budget (passed earlier in the meeting). Ronin proposes a storage clean out day on Sunday, June 17th. Pizza lunch to be provided by the Barony. Polling for \$100 for pizza on storage cleanup day occurred. The polling passed. Further details will be shared at a later time.

Prize Czar - The office is open, as the previous Czar/Czarina had to step down. We are looking for interested parties. The Seneschal currently has all the prizes except for a few held by the Exchequer.

Web Minister - Updates for Grand Coronation were made. The site for Baronial Birthday is up and being updated. The information for Simple Day has not been provided yet, but a site is in progress - the information was promised by this weekend by the autocrat <Update: the site is now up>. A discussion of web stats for the previous 2 years occurred. We've had visitors from people in 78 countries, in 700+ cities. Most visitors in order by number: Indianapolis, Chicago, New York City. The rest of the top 50 is rounded out by cities in the Midrealm, with cities in our immediate area appearing higher on the list. Event sites have not been tracking web stats because the Web Minister made an error and left out the code from those pages, so the information we've got only includes the main Sternfeld site and not the event websites themselves. This will no longer be the case as of the Simple Day Website.

Events:

Grand Coronation Review - Rough estimate of \$2300 profit on Grand Coronation. The site is not charging us for some extra usage of the site that was not planned ahead of time. There are still outstanding receipts coming in. The event went very well overall, and was very well attended. There were some issues day of that were not planned for, but they were dealt with with the usual professionalism and speediness that volunteers in this Barony are known for. A group has been formed to discuss whether Grand Pageant as an event should be continued to be offered.

Baronial Birthday - Fighting/Fencing Champions are to be selected at Fighter Practice the Tuesday before the event. It is June 2nd at St. Timothy's, and starts at 11 AM. There will be an A&S competition for Largesse Baskets. Also a potluck feast with Barony providing the

meat. A class for newcomers has been added. Details for the event are available at <http://www.midrealm.org/sternfeld/birthday.php>

Simple Day - The Pale Ad has been submitted. The Autocrat is working with the Exchequer to get ACCEPS setup for online preregistration. The website is coming soon.

The feast budget was discussed. The submitted budget prices feast at \$8, with 150 available seats. They ask for a \$900 budget to feed the 150 paid seats plus 50 comped seats. The break even point would be sales of 113 feast tickets. Discussion on the topic raised the question of why so many comped seats. In addition to royalty, head table and kitchen staff, the plan includes two shifts of servers, as the feast is being served tavern-style over a four hour period. Further discussion led to the conclusion that dinner does not need to be served for a full four hours as was originally requested. Several of the cooks in attendance agreed to meet with the Feastocrat at this weekend's Cooks Group to revise plans and resubmit. The revised budget will be polled on at Tuesday's fighter practice. Because the event is getting close, the second polling will likely be taken care of by the emergency finance committee prior to June's business meeting.

There will be an A&S Competition during dinner - contact Colette to participate. The winner(s) will be determined by a bean count. Make sure to bring your own feast gear to the event. We've been offered the option of doing an equestrian demo at Simple Day. The populace seemed generally in favor of the idea, so the Autocrat is following up with the site to confirm it is possible. (They expected us to have horses last year, apparently, so it is likely to be ok.) We will also need to get an additional insurance certificate (cost \$50 - will come out of the \$300 in the event budget for overruns) if we have equestrian at this event.

Post Pennsic Picnic in the Park by the Pond - Bids are open. The event is smaller, simpler to manage, and is the easiest one we have. This would be a great event to autocrat for someone who wants to get their feet wet on planning an event but don't want to start with something too big.

Ren faire - The Ren Faire only wants fencing, fighting and archery from us this year. There will not be a village done by our group as in past years. As a result, we can expect less compensation for the group from the event - any shortfall in our budget has already come in from the profit from Grand Pageant, luckily.

BWTA - We discovered the date may move to Feb 23rd to avoid conflict with Val Day. More information/confirmation and budget next month.

Yule - We need a bid.

(NOT TECHNICALLY STERNFELD) SCA 50 Year - Deadline for bids for this event is July 1st. It would take place summer 2016. Master Llewelan and others are putting together a bid to hold the event locally/semi-locally. It would be a Kingdom/Society event and not use Baronial Funds. Since it's in Sternfeld, Llew asked for the Barony's blessing. A polling in support of the idea was submitted and passed. In discussion, it was mentioned that we might want to decrease the size of Simple Day that year if the bid is accepted as it would be two weeks after SCA 50 Year.

Simple Day 2013 - Dates will likely be July 5-7. The autocrat for Simple Day 2012 will contact the site to see if there is availability on those dates.
